MOVIE TERMS

Antagonist -- tries to stop the Protagonist, usually the bad guy

Back Story -- what happened before the main story

CG--computer graphics

Catalyst -- early event which creates the main plot (problem)

Character Arc -- how the character changes/grows

Comic Relief -- a small laugh in a big drama

Conflict -- fight, struggle

Dramatic Foreshadow -- an early scene that predicts a later scene

Flashback -- when the story goes back in time

Genre--thematic style (comedy, action/adventure etc.)

Inciting Incident--sets the story in motion

Inside Story--psychological drama

Jump Cut--middle of a continuous scene is removed

Montage -- series of short scenes that rush the story forward

Outside Story -- the action, what we see

Protagonist -- person who wants something, usually the good guy

Soliloguy--speak your thoughts

Subtext--deeper meaning of dialog

Three-Act Structure

This is the standard structure (formula) of most Hollywood films. The first act (30 minutes) introduces characters and conflict. The second act (1 hour) develops characters and story. The third act, the climax, (30 minutes) resolves the conflict. Total movie time is about 2 hours.
